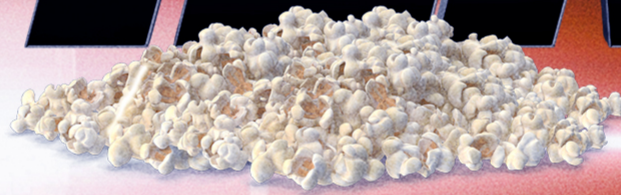




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SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS



Week 1

Text: Revelation 19:11-21

Topic: Judgment, Evil, Triumph

Big Idea of the Message: Though evil is real and powerful, in the end it will be defeated forever through the power of Jesus Christ.

Applicational Point: We can persevere through evil and suffering by placing our hope in Christ.

Film: *Avengers: Infinity War* (May 4, 2018)

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. When you look at the state of our world, do you feel optimistic or pessimistic? Why?
3. Why is it important to remember that we're not fighting flesh and blood, but our enemy, Satan?
4. How does this passage offer you comfort or hope?
5. Is there anything hard in your life right now where you would love to have some extra hope of God's victory?
6. How can I pray for you?



Week 2

Text: Revelation 21:1-7; Romans 8:9-11; Matthew 6:10

Topic: Kingdom, Evangelism

Big Idea of the Message: The promise of the gospel is not for us to “escape” to heaven, but for God’s Kingdom to come to earth through the power of Christ in us.

Applicational Point: Instead of separating ourselves from the world around us with a wall, we can be a bridge for the world to encounter the living God.

Film: *Hotel Transylvania 3* (July 13, 2018)

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week’s message?
2. Why do you think God leaves us here on earth after we are saved instead of sweeping us straight up into heaven?
3. How can we balance wanting to separate ourselves from evil *and* reach out to those who are not inside of the church?
4. How can a kid your age reach others for Christ?
5. Is there anyone in your life right now who needs to know that Jesus died for them to have a relationship with God?
6. How can I pray for you?



Week 3

Text: Job 12:13-25

Topic(s): The Greatness of God, Justice, Holiness, Repentance.

Big Idea of the Message: God is in control over all peoples, places, and things.

Application Point: Rather than trying to get what you want all of the time, give God control of your life.

Movie: *Avengers 4* - Title subject to change (scheduled to release May 3, 2019)

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's lesson?
2. Do you like superhero movies? How is God like a superhero? How is he not like a superhero?
3. How does God's love and justice go hand in hand? Why can't love exist without justice?
4. Is God in control of all? Does that make you feel good? Why?
5. What do you worry about? Is this because you haven't given God full control of your life? What areas might you be keeping from him?
6. How can I pray for you?



Week 4

Text: Genesis 12:10-20, 20:1-18, 26:6-16

Topic: Obedience, Role Models

Big Idea of the Message: Human parents aren't perfect, but our Father in heaven is perfect in love and wisdom.

Applicational Point: Jesus is the best hero to imitate.

Film: *The Incredibles 2* (June 15, 2018)

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. If you could have one superpower, what would it be and why?
3. Why is it so fun to imitate superheroes?
4. Why do you think God wants us to know him as a Father, not just as a master or a king?
5. Would anyone like to share your story of how you came to know Jesus as your own real-life hero?
