Week 1

Text: John 11:17–27

Topic: Jesus, Resurrection, Hope

Big Idea of the Message: The resurrection of Jesus changed everything—not just in religious terms but for the rest of history and the working of God in the world.

Application Point: We will live a life in Jesus, because he is the source of life now and to come.

Discussion Questions:

Week 2

Big Idea of the Message: Because of the resurrection of Jesus, believers have a future hope of resurrection and eternal life.

Application Point: We will live knowing that we have a future hope of eternal life through the resurrection.

Discussion Questions:

4. What does Paul tell the church at Corinth about the resurrection?
5. Why is Jesus's resurrection important?

Week 3

Text: Romans 8:10–15

Topic: Resurrection, Victory, Sin

Big Idea of the Message: Through the resurrection, Christ has conquered sin and death; believers can live free of bondage to darkness and sin.

Application Point: We will combat sin because of the victory of Christ's resurrection.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Do you like underdog stories? Why?
3. What does Paul teach in Romans 8 about sin?
4. What are the implications of the resurrection regarding combating sin in the life of a believer?
5. How could we apply this resurrecting power in our lives?
6. How can we pray for you?



Week 4

Text: Matthew 28:19–20

Topic: Resurrection, Mission, Great Commission

Big Idea of the Message: The resurrection of Christ becomes the catalyst for the mission of the church to reflect the kingdom of God and spread the gospel.

Application Point: We will proclaim and live out the gospel of Jesus.

Discussion Questions:

3. What is the Great Commission?
