

Week 1

Text: Hebrews 1:1–14


Topic: Supremacy of Jesus, Divinity of Jesus, Revelation

Big Idea of the Message: Jesus is above all and is the full revelation of God.

Application Point: We must see Jesus as the final and full revelation of God, not just a part of God's revelation.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. What qualifies someone to be considered the greatest?
3. Why is Christ supreme over all?
4. How do you feel about Jesus being the final revelation that all others led up to?
5. What are some examples of when we might lessen a teaching of Jesus in our lives?

Week 2

Text: Hebrews 3:1–6, 12–19; 4:11


Topic: Supremacy of Christ, Rest, Honesty with God

Big Idea of the Message: Jesus is greater than any former spiritual leader, and we should not lack belief in him.

Application Point: We must fully believe in Jesus and find our rest in him.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Who is one person you think is a spiritual powerhouse?
3. Why was declaring Jesus as having more honor than Moses so important?
4. Have you known believers who have complaints with God that have affected their faith?
5. What are ways we can find rest in Christ in a chaotic world?

Week 3

Text: Hebrews 4:14–16; 5:1–6


Topic: High Priest, Mediator

Big Idea of the Message: Jesus is the only mediator between God and humanity.

Application Point: We must boldly approach God through the mediating work of Christ.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. What is a mediator?
3. Why do you think people are drawn to psychics and mediums?
4. Why is it so important to trust that Jesus is the only way to God?
5. What are ways we can boldly approach God with confidence?

Week 4

Text: Hebrews 5:11–6:12


Topic: Maturity, Spiritual Infancy, Cultural Christianity

Big Idea of the Message: God expects us to grow in our spiritual formation.

Application Point: We must grow in our walk with Christ and lead others to grow as believers.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Can fools grow old?
3. What are some things you don't feed infants?
4. Do you think it is easy for people to remain spiritual babies? Why?
5. What are ways that we can grow in Christ and become mature believers?
How can we help others do the same?

Week 5

Text: Hebrews 9:9–26; 10:1


Topic: Sacrifice, Blood of Jesus

Big Idea of the Message: The sacrifice of Jesus has made all other sacrifices obsolete; it alone is the full payment for sin.

Application Point: We must walk in the salvation that is only provided by the sacrifice of Christ and not our works.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. How do you feel about animals dying in the Old Testament sacrificial system?
3. Does it seem harsh that it takes blood to forgive sins?
4. How would you describe salvation to someone else?
5. What are ways that we try to work for our salvation, instead of fully trusting Jesus?
6. How can I pray for you?



Week 6

Text: Hebrews 11:1–40


Topic: Faith

Big Idea of the Message: Faith goes beyond mental assent; it is an active confidence in what God will do.

Application Point: We must walk by faith in our daily relationship with Jesus.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. What is your favorite song that mentions the word *faith*?
3. How would you define faith?
4. Do you have the faith that can see what isn't reality yet?
5. Reflect on the people in Hebrews 11:35b–40. Why do the faithful sometimes suffer more than the unfaithful?
6. What are ways we can encourage each other live "by faith"?
7. How can I pray for you?



Week 7

Text: Hebrews 12:1–17


Topic: Salvation, Eternal Security

Big Idea of the Message: God is a loving Father who wants his children to grow and reflect Christ in their lives.

Application Point: We must persevere in our faith, and our lives will reflect our salvation.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Have you ever met someone who struggled with their faith in Jesus? How did you respond to them?
3. Have you ever been in a conversation where the topic of losing salvation came up? What questions did it raise for you?
4. Where do our works (how we live) fit in the salvation we have in Jesus?
5. What are ways that we can persevere even when we might be struggling?
6. How can I pray for you?



Week 8

Text: Hebrews 13:1–8

Topic: Hospitality, Contentment

Big Idea of the Message: Christians are to show hospitality, be content, and live holy lives.

Application Point: We must be loving to strangers and find contentment in Christ.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Name one place that has great hospitality.
3. Who is a stranger? How should Christians be hospitable to strangers?
4. Do you think contentment is hard? Why or why not?
5. What is a holy life? How can we live holy lives?
6. How can I pray for you?
