Week 1

Text: Matthew 6:19–24

Topics: Money, Obedience, Wealth, Generosity

Big Idea of the Message: God invites us to build his kingdom rather than our own.

Application Point: The believer's relationship with money has to filter through God's values. To live for him in this modern society, we must be willing to live counterculturally by being generous and investing in a way that puts people before possessions.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. In what ways do God's values seem different from the world's values? Give examples.
3. Do you consider yourself or your family wealthy, poor, or somewhere in the middle? Why?
4. What are unspoken rules in your church, family, or school? Are they valid or silly?
5. What is something you would find hard to give away if God asked you to?
6. Do you think God rewards us for being good? Why or why not?
7. How can we pray for you?



Week 2

Text: 1 Timothy 6:6–10, 17–19

Topics: Money, Contentment, Generosity, Greed

Big Idea of the Message: Paul instructs those who desire to be rich and those who are rich to find contentment and fulfillment in Christ, rather than worldly riches.

Application Point: Money has a way of twisting our good intentions into idols. Practicing faithful generosity allows us to avoid the temptation of greed and instead steward well the gifts God has given us.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. In what ways can money corrupt?
3. How do we find contentment in Christ?
4. Do you think you should still give or tithe when you are struggling financially? Why or why not?
5. What does it mean to be a good steward?
6. Do you think accumulating wealth is a sin? Why or why not?
7. How can we pray for you?



Week 3

Text: Luke 19:1–10; 2 Corinthians 8:1–5

Topics: Money, Wealth, Generosity, Community, Mutual Aid

Big Idea of the Message: God changes how we spend and share our resources.

Application Point: Zacchaeus and the churches in Macedonia give us models of allowing Christ to transform our hearts so generosity becomes our normal response rather than the exception, as we model the way God's kingdom works.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. How do the stories of Zacchaeus and of the Macedonians encourage you to be generous?
3. How is generosity an act of faith?
4. In what ways do you practice generosity that goes beyond just giving money away?
5. What can you cut back on to allow more opportunity, funds, or time for generosity?
6. How can we pray for you?



Week 4

Text: Proverbs 28:1–28

Topics: Money, Wisdom, Oppression

Big Idea of the Message: God wants us to be people of integrity and generosity, regardless of our economic status.

Application Point: There are always places for us to invest. Caring for others, sharing as we can, and contributing to the world aren't as complicated as we make them. Focus on Jesus, with kindness toward your fellow human, and the opportunities will make themselves known.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Why does integrity matter? Give an example of someone in your life who showed integrity when it was difficult.
3. Why does God want us to care for the poor or less fortunate? How do you do that?
4. Does money bring happiness? What brings you the most happiness?
5. In what ways can you contribute to the world right now?
6. How can we pray for you?
